# <u> Tastor's Tage</u>

#### "Let the little children come to me."

I recently attended the baptism of my 9-month-old granddaughter, Vanessa. My son's wife is Catholic, so they decided to have her baptized by the priest in a Catholic church. Of course, much of the ritual is very similar to what we do in the Protestant church, but there are a few differences. Along with using the water from the fount, they also have an oil anointing of the child. I will often do an oil anointing as a blessing for someone in the hospital. I will also bless a child during Communion, if the parents prefer that over the child receiving the elements.

Along with the traditional words used in a baptism, the priest also gave a very short homily, and included Matthew 19:13-15:

"Then children were being brought to him in order that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples spoke sternly to those who brought them, but Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me, and do not stop them, for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs.' And he laid his hands on them and went on his way."

It is important to remember that children in Jesus' time were not necessarily regarded as special, except to their own parents. Many cultures today look on children as especially sweet, innocent, and even wise. Jewish culture in that day probably did not see children in such endearing terms. The disciples most likely rebuked those bringing the children to Jesus because they believed that bringing children to Jesus was so-cially improper, or because they thought the children would bother Jesus. It is likely that their move to hinder the parents from bringing their children to Jesus was motivated not by unkindness but by a desire to respect Jesus' position as a teacher. But Jesus wanted the children to come to him. He said, *"Let the children come,"* because he wanted to bless them.

Scripture often compares believers to children. In fact, Jesus told those following him, "*Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heav-en*" (Matthew 18:3–4).

Jesus' command to "let the little children come to me" reveals a few things for us:

1) Children need to be given a variety of opportunities to know the Lord.

2) Blessing the children was important to Jesus and should be important to us.

3) Parents should be encouraged to bring their children to worship at an early age so that it becomes natural for them.

Children implicitly trust their parents, just as believers trust God. Giving our children the opportunity to learn and experience God's love through Jesus is just as much the responsibility of the church as it is the parents. How good are we at fulfilling that task?

We have talked about the importance of making some changes, and doing those things that would make EUCC more attractive to young families with children. I know "change" is a scary word for many. If we believe that God is doing a new thing, are we willing to embrace change, or do we pre-fer doing things the same way they have always been done?


## Updates to Church Directory Now Available
