The Three Pillars of Lent

The three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These practices have been a part of the church tradition for centuries and are still observed by many Christians today.

<u>**Prayer</u></u> is an essential aspect of the Lenten season. During this time, individuals are encouraged to reflect on their relationship with God and to seek a deeper spiritual connection with the divine. This can be achieved through daily prayers, attending church services, or participating in devotional activities such as the Stations of the Cross.</u>**

Fasting is another important aspect of Lent. It involves giving up certain luxuries or desires for a period of time in order to focus on spiritual needs. This can take many forms, such as giving up food for a day, abstaining from certain foods for a period of time, or giving up other things like television or social media. The purpose of fasting is to help individuals draw closer to God by acknowledging their dependence on God and breaking away from worldly distractions.

<u>Almsgiving</u> is the third pillar of Lent and involves helping those in need. This can involve donating to charities, volunteering time at a local soup kitchen, or helping a neighbor in need. Almsgiving is an expression of compassion and love. It is an integral part of the entire season, as it helps individuals to focus on their obligations to others and to live a life of selflessness and service.

The three pillars of Lent – prayer, fasting, and almsgiving – serve as a reminder of the importance of spiritual growth and reflection. Through these practices, individuals can deepen their faith, strengthen their relationship with God, and live a more meaningful and purposeful life.

As you know, we have been collecting items for the local Children's Protective Services office for quite some time. We have made several very large deliveries to CPS, but the need is still very real.

Currently, when children are removed from their homes, they stay at the CPS office until appropriate foster care can be found. When the Isaiah House of Spencer-Perry Counties opens, children will be taken there; as stated in an article in the Perry County News on January 30, 2023, Isaiah House coordinators hope the home will be completed by this summer. No matter where the children will be staying during their transition to foster care, they leave their homes with nothing but the clothes on their backs. Through our generous donations, the children are provided socks, underwear, and pajamas. Once the Isaiah House opens, our donations will still be used to help the children.

DEDICATION OF RENOVATED LIBRARY AND CHAPEL SET FOR MARCH 26

In the early 1920's, a decision was made by the church to build an addition to provide space for Sunday School rooms. The building we still refer to as the "round addition" was begun in the summer of 1923 and dedicated February 24, 1924. It housed Sunday School rooms on the upper level, a chapel and library on the main level, and a kitchen and dining area in the basement. This area, along with the attached former "green room," remained relatively unchanged for nearly a century.

In the fall and winter of 2019-2020, the Council approved an extensive renovation to the library, chapel, and green room. Under the direction of Council members Chris Goffinet, Sean Risse, and Chris Van Note, the library was moved to the green room and is now a beautiful area for meetings, reading, and browsing the library. The former library and chapel were renovated into a more functional chapel, a kitchenette was added in one of the side rooms, and a play area and two meditation chapels were added. Further, storage was added for the Worship Resource Team to store banners. The renovations were made possible through the generosity of the Thelander Endowment and the Nubby and Ruth Ann Werner family.

The newly renovated areas were just put into use when we shuttered our building due to Covid. We now feel it is time to properly dedicate the spaces and put them into use. Therefore, a dedication has been planned for **Sunday, March 26, 2023, immediately following worship**. A short dedication will take place, then refreshments will be provided. All EUCC members, as well as members of the community, are invited. For those in need of assistance to reach the area, a chair lift is available through the Fellowship Hall entrance.

We look forward to seeing you at the dedication!
