Pastor's Page

Friends, I recently completed a 40-hour online continuing education course for certification as a Mental Health Coach. Many denominations are beginning to realize that folks in their faith communities may be struggling with a variety of mental health concerns. Research also shows that those folks will often come to their pastor for support, before considering going to a therapist or psychiatrist.

Following is a description of the importance of Mental Health Coaching, as taken from the course materials:

"A mental health coach can be a bridge between a family and the mental healthcare system that allows individuals to access resources easily, quickly and at virtually no cost. A mental health coach is therapeutically effective, as they help individuals manage their illness more effectively, while growing closer to God. The mental health coach will be a point on a continuum that currently does not exist in the mental healthcare system, to assist pastors to get the mentally ill the therapeutic and supportive intervention needed to recover more fully."

As someone who has dealt with the challenge of anxiety, depression, PTSD, and panic attacks for much of my life, I know how hard it is to reach out for help. Having access to a qualified Mental Health Coach, who is also someone you already know and trust, should make it easier to take that first step in seeking help and support.

There are two things I'd like to highlight.
