# **Tastor's Tage**

#### TIME AND TALENT

God encourages each of Christ's followers to make a commitment to utilize our Spirit given talents, which are given to each one of us through his grace.

I would like for you to reflect upon Jesus' parable of The Talents. Jesus spoke about a man who gave money to three of his servants. Two of them used that money wisely and were able to make even more money for their master. The third servant was so worried about losing the money that he buried it to keep it safe. Although he did not lose any of the money, he was also unable to make any money.

Like so many of Jesus' parables, he tells us this one to teach us a lesson. That lesson is, God does not want us to hide our gifts and talents. Instead, he wants us to use them to spread his love and his message to the world. When we do, we help others to do the same. It is like we are planting seeds that have fallen from a tree that keeps giving more and more of God's work in the world.

Focus your attention on the following readings from two of Paul's Epistles:

"For as in one body we have many members and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the encourager, in encouragement; the giver, in sincerity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness" (Romans 12:4-8).

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God - not the result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we may walk in them" (Ephesians 2:8-10).

#### **Your Time**

We tend to utilize our time based on how important a task is in relation to our interests and concerns without prayerfully considering how it relates to God's intention of granting us time through his grace.

A portion of how we use our time should be considered as a spiritual act of worship and in thanksgiving for all he has done for us.

#### **Your Talents**

# VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO HELP WITH ON-LINE WORSHIP SERVICES AND SOUNDBOARD

When our doors were closed due to the pandemic, a team worked quickly to put together the equipment and skills needed to have an on-line presence so our services could be live streamed. Over the years, we have purchased better equipment and have fine-tuned the process so that we deliver a quality on-line worship service. Even though we are having in-person worship again, the on-line presence will not go away. This is a valuable and necessary ministry. We regularly have 5 families who watch the live stream during worship time, and there are dozens more views during the week.

We currently have 3 teams of 2 who rotate Sundays running the soundboard and the audio/visual equipment. With vacations and other commitments during worship (such as serving as the liturgist or an usher), the 6 of us who do this important work for the church really do need more help. It isn't difficult. The soundboard technician mutes and unmutes mics and adjusts the volume. The audio/visual technician starts the live stream, moves the camera, plays the streamed songs, and stops the live stream. Everything is prepared in advance and set up prior to Sunday morning. It's really just a matter of pushing buttons and clicking keys.

Of course, training will be provided. You will not be left to do the live stream on your own until you are comfortable doing so.
