A seminary friend of mine, Father R. Joseph Ignatius-Francis Owles, a priest in the Old Catholic Church, wrote the following:

You don't have to spend your time and energy trying to figure out what your purpose is and what God's plan is for your life.

YOU ARE THE PLAN! BEING YOU IS YOUR PURPOSE!

You are uniquely qualified to be who you are. Nobody else can do it. You are the answer to somebody's prayer. You are the miracle that someone has been waiting for.

We tend to think that we are called by God, but we are called to be someone or something we are not. We tend to deny that God is really calling us as we are, but calling the person we should become.

God has called you -- not who you or others think you should be, but you as you are right now. God is calling you to be who you are because no one else can do the job of you. That is your purpose and you being you is part of the plan.

In the end faith comes down to accepting that we are acceptable. Faith is accepting that God accepts me right now, flaws and all. We do not accept that we are acceptable, we tend to set out to prove it. When we believe we are unlovable, we tend to behave in ways that prove that we are unlovable.

When we accept that we are lovable and acceptable to God (and to others) then we have nothing left to prove, and we can finally be the people we are capable of being.

What a valuable lesson for us to learn! How many of us go through life pleading with God to reveal to us our purpose? So many wasted years thinking that we should be something we are not, trying to be something we are not, when, the whole time, we were exactly where God wanted us to be, and we were exactly who God made us to be!

Did I waste 20 years of my life running from God, or was God preparing me for the ministry to which I was being called. During that 20 year span I become very involved in the United Methodist Church; I graduated from high school and college with honors; I got married to a wonderful woman and we had two terrific kids; I worked in hospital administration for 10 years; I became very involved in the Presbyterian Church; and, then I went to seminary. Was this wasted time, or was God guiding me through a period of preparation, so that I could be the pastor that God wanted me to be?

You are exactly who God wants you to be. God may be preparing you for new duties or responsibilities in the future, but, right now, you are everything that God needs you to be. Delight in who you are, trusting that God has created you to be a unique and blessed individual.

LIBRARY AND CHAPEL AREAS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Just a reminder that our beautifully-renovated library and chapel areas are open to the public for use during office hours and for meetings after hours. Members and visitors who wish to take their lunch break, who need a place for meditation or prayer, who want to read or work a puzzle, or who simply seek a quiet, serene atmosphere are invited to spend time at the church. The rooms are open to visitors during church office hours. If your organization needs a place for an evening meeting, contact the church office (812.547.7059) to make arrangements to use the space.

Guests should enter the building through the Jefferson Street doors and sign the sign-in sheet on the bulletin board outside the church office. Anyone who needs to use a chair lift should call ahead to make arrangements to enter through the Fellowship Hall doors.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO HELP WITH ON-LINE WORSHIP SERVICES AND SOUNDBOARD

When our doors were closed due to the pandemic, a team worked quickly to put together the equipment and skills needed to have an on-line presence so our services could be live streamed. Over the years, we have purchased better equipment and have fine-tuned the process so that we deliver a quality on-line worship service. Even though we are having in-person worship again, the on-line presence will not go away. This is a valuable and necessary ministry. We regularly have 5 families who watch the live stream during worship time, and there are dozens more views during the week.

We currently have 3 teams of 2 who rotate Sundays running the soundboard and the audio/visual equipment. With vacations and other commitments during worship (such as serving as the liturgist or an usher), the 6 of us who do this important work for the church really do need more help. It isn't difficult. The soundboard technician mutes and unmutes mics and adjusts the volume. The audio/visual technician starts the live stream, moves the camera, plays the streamed songs, and stops the live stream. Everything is prepared in advance and set up prior to Sunday morning. It's really just a matter of pushing buttons and clicking keys.

Of course, training will be provided. You will not be left to do the live stream on your own until you are comfortable doing so.

They do this with a vast array of computer equipment, part of which is tied into the sound board. Live streamed worship is here to stay, and this group has worked very hard to produce a quality experience for our viewers.

We are working on a proposal to upgrade our cameras. Also, we are looking for more people to be involved with this important part of our ministry. Please give prayerful consideration to volunteering to be a part of the Audio/Visual Team. Training is provided.
